The Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) of the City of Titusville, Florida met in regular session in the Council Chamber of City Hall, 555 South Washington Avenue, on Tuesday, December 10, 2024.

Call to Order/Determination of a Quorum

Chairperson Connors called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. Present were Chairperson Andrew Connors, Vice-Chairperson Herman Cole, Jr. Col USAF Retired, and Members Megan Moscoso, Jo Lynn Nelson, Dr. Sarah Stoeckel, Greg Aker and Jim Ball, Executive Director Scott Larese, Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Attorney Richard Broome, and Sr. Administrative Assistant Emily Campbell were also present. Sr. Administrative Assistant Emily Campbell completed the minutes of the meeting.

Invocation/Pledge of Allegiance

Chairperson Connors asked for a moment of silence and then led the entire assembly in the *Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag*. Sr. Administrative Assistant Emily Campbell read the procedure for public comment.

Approval of Minutes –

Motion: Member Nelson moved to approve the minutes of the Community Redevelopment Agency meeting on Tuesday, November 12, 2024, with corrections. Staff made corrections prior to the meeting. The revised minutes were distributed to the CRA. Vice-Chair Cole seconded the motion.

Special Recognitions and Presentations – None.

Old Business

CRA Grant Criteria Update – Executive Director Larese advised the request was to review and approve the amended grant applications and policies and procedures.

During the January 9, 2024, Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Board meeting, the CRA Board directed staff to review the CRA Grant program and evaluation criteria and propose changes. The staff proposed the following changes:

- Eliminate the 2-year waiting period for approval for project funding.
- Include a contingency coverage in the grant application not to exceed the maximum grant program amount.
- Create consistency by changing the Exterior Grant maximum to \$50,000 so that the Interior and Exterior Grants have the same maximum amount.
- For projects of \$5,000 or less, 60% was paid by the City of Titusville and 40% by the applicant.

Redevelopment Planner Sue Williams provided a powerpoint that highlighted as follows:

- Community Redevelopment Agency Commercial Grant Program
- Roots Kava Lounge 400 Garden Street
- Launch Now 300-310 South Washington
- Catbird LLC 213 Broad Street
- North Brevard Historical Museum 301 South Washington
- 422 Julia Street Titusville Playhouse Property
- CRA Downtown Commercial Grants
- CRA Commercial Grants Approved in FY 2024 Total \$127,003.63

Member Nelson asked if the provision for the exterior grant that required the owner to reimburse the City for the grants if they sell within five years, applied to the interior grants.

Redevelopment Planner Sue Williams stated that the interior grant did not include a provision that required the owner to reimburse the City if they sold the property within five years.

Member Ball stated that he was not in support of the reimbursement requirement if the building was sold within five years for the interior grants or exterior grant.

Member Aker stated that he was in support of the reimbursement requirement if sold within five years.

Member Moscoso asked if the forms for the interior and exterior grants would be available online for individuals to complete.

Redevelopment Planner Sue Williams stated that the grant paperwork was extensive and staff found that assisting the grant applicants in person to complete out the paper work was more effective. She stated that staff was currently reviewing an online form for special events.

Motion: Member Nelson moved to approve the amended grant applications and policies and procedures, as recommended. Vice-Chair Cole seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

Recommended Action:

Approve advisability for staff to research camera types and locations working with our IT Department and Code Enforcement Department.

Summary Explanation & Background:

The safety cameras located at the Welcome Center are outdated (installed in 2016/2017), can only be accessed locally and do not provide the level of security consistent with other city facilities. Currently, the cameras do not provide enough visibility for police needs. Staff recommends installing new cameras with the ability for the police department to access them. Staff is requesting approval for advisability to research cameras and bring options back to the Community Redevelopment Agency for direction.

Summary Explanation & Background:

This action is a team effort with the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) staff and Code Enforcement Staff. The purpose of this project is to create a positive activity generator encouraging legitimate users of our parks and other locations in the CRA.

This path promotes health and wellness and also celebrates Titusville's vibrant role in the space industry. The proposal is a 1-mile pedestrian course starting at the American Space Museum and ending at Space View Park. Five (5) permanent signs will be needed to indicate the course every 1/4 mile. The cost of the weather and UV resistant, 12 by 18 inches signs are \$47.50 each. The signs will be installed by the Public Works department.

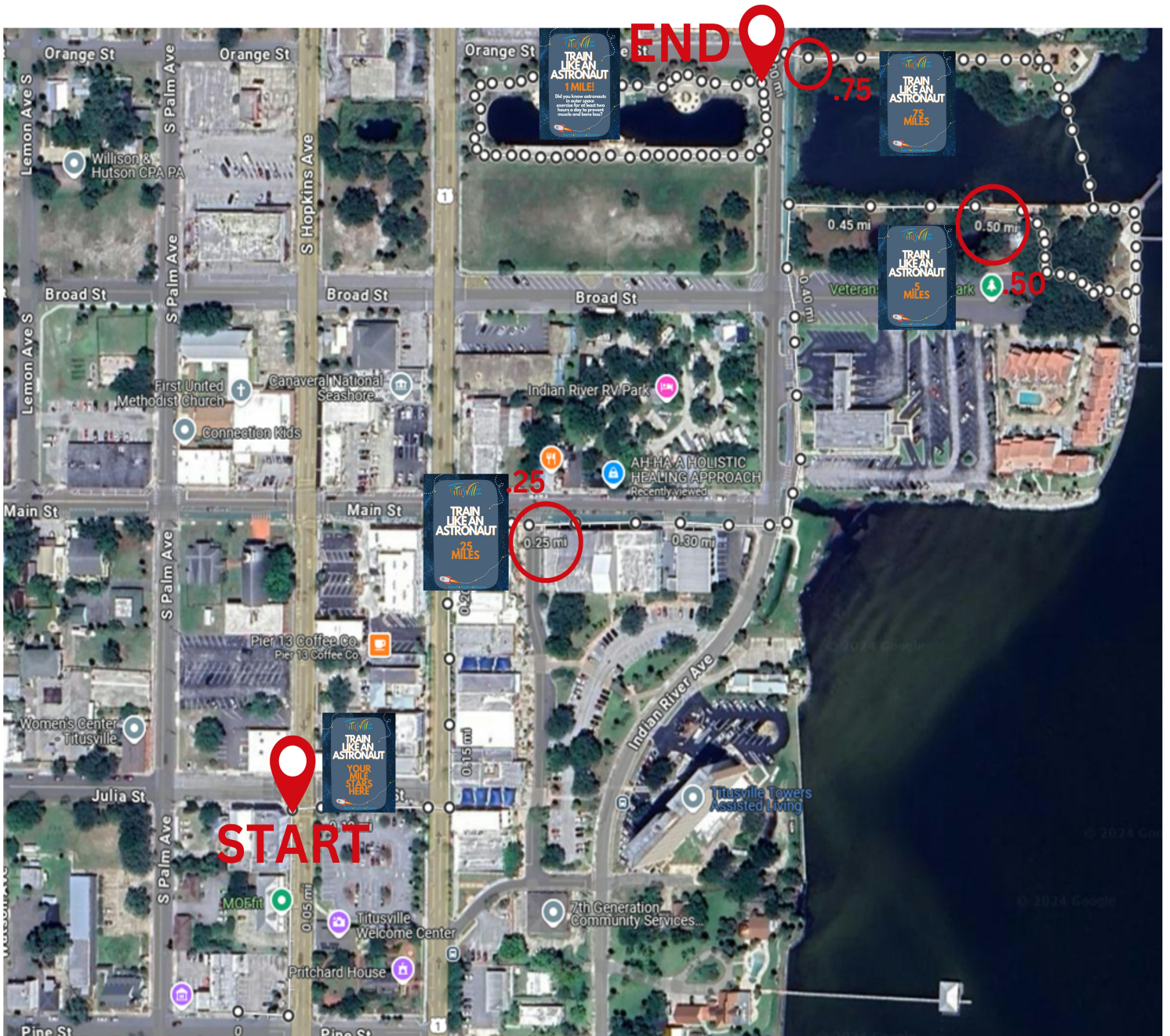

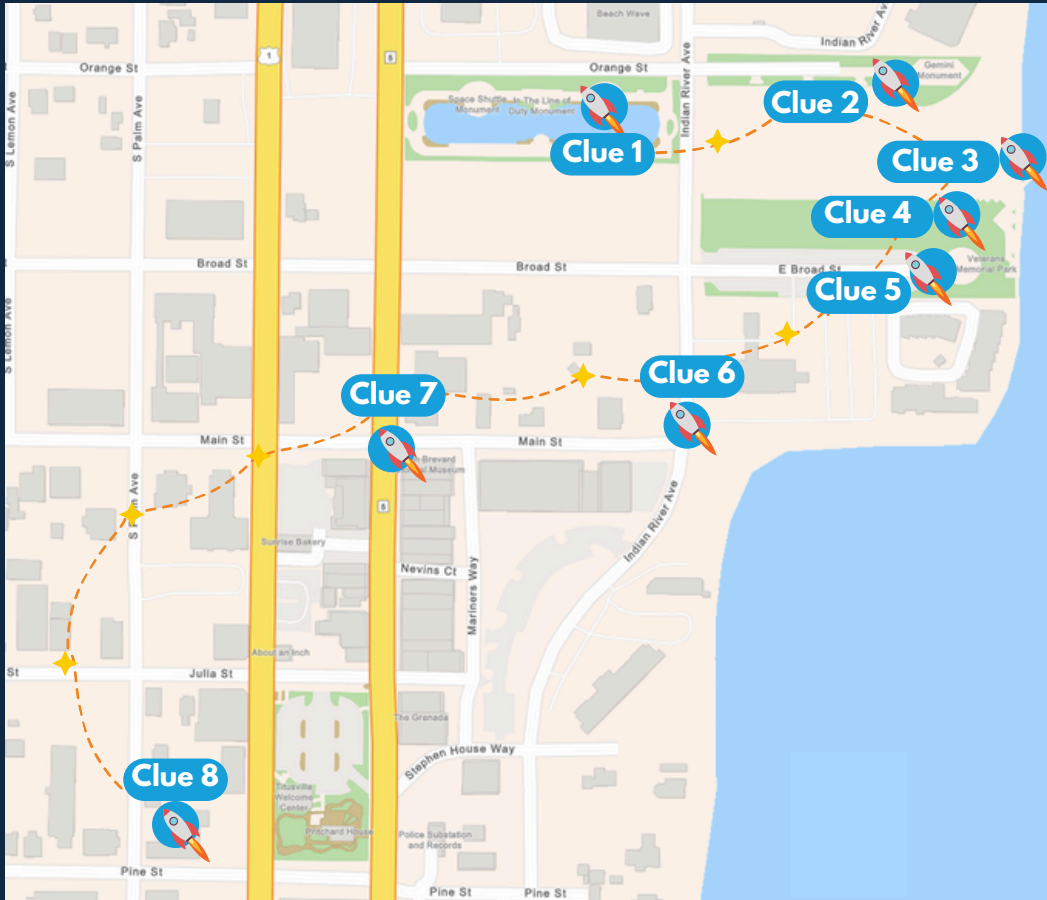

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is proposing to repave the southbound lanes of U.S. 1 (North Washington Avenue/South Hopkins Avenue/Edison Avenue) from the FEC Railroad bridge to Grace Street in Titusville. The resurfacing will extend the life of the existing roadway. This project also proposed traffic signal upgrades at Garden Street (State Road (S.R.) 406), Main Street, Julia Street, South Street (S.R. 405) and Grace Street.

Pedestrian safety enhancements will include improved crosswalks, pedestrian curb ramp reconstruction to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, and construction of sidewalk to connect to existing bus stops.

This project is State Funded, and the cost is approximately \$3.9 million for design and construction. Estimated start date early 2025.

For your information, the project will involve the replacement of the traffic signal boxes which will require new wraps.

Project Manager Tyler Burgett presented at the August 13, 2024, CRA Meeting.

Staff is following up with Michael Sanders with FDOT regarding a speed zone study.

Capital Projects in the Downtown

1. Sidewalk Infill & Repair

The CRA approved a scope for the consultant DRMP, Inc. to develop a plan for sidewalk infill and repair at the November 22, 2022, CRA meeting. A work order has been issued to DRMP. The draft has been received by Public Works staff. Work planned for this fiscal year.

2. Spaceview Park Observation/Walkway Pier

Project is completed and Ribbon Cutting was held on April 22, 2024, at 11:00 AM.

3. Indian River Avenue Utilities Infrastructure Improvements – Project started in August 2023 and is in progress/construction. This project is completed, and repaving is in process and almost complete.

4. Stormwater Infrastructure – The grant from the Save Our Indian River Lagoon (SOIRL) Grant Program for the tree box filters project in the Main Street – Indian River Ave. – Commons Parking area has been approved. The Grant agreement has been received from SOIRL; staff has finalized project grant approval from FDEP. Design is complete. The construction work order was awarded at the 6/11 Council Meeting and was fully funded by grant funds. Request for Direction of funds on July 9, 2024, CRA Agenda. Funds allocated to low impact development (LID) demonstration project below.

5. Low Impact Development (LID) Demonstration Project – on July 9, 2024 CRA approved \$149,742 to be utilized for a low impact development demonstration project along Indian River Ave. This project will create a bioswale and pervious parking spaces that will reduce nutrient loadings and discharges to the Indian River Lagoon. Project is currently in design.

6. Whiteway Replacement – The CRA approved the consultant DRMP, Inc. to develop a design scope for the Whiteway Replacement at the November 22, 2022, meeting. A work order has been issued to DRMP and is in design. Public Works is following up regarding status.

Redevelopment Planner Sue Williams said that fifty more of the Joynerville & Beyond booklets were ordered and the funds came out of the Planning Department's budget.

Ms. Williams said that a building permit to repair the seawall was issued for the 715 Indian River Avenue property, and that is the only permit issued at this time. The structure is not on any historical registries.

Member Shifalo stated that she would like the Joynerville community to always be involved when their community is discussed.

Vice Chairman Petyk said she would like for the Historic Preservation Board members to also be involved in meetings that pertain to the historic areas of Titusville. Ms. Williams said that she is also the liaison to the Community Redevelopment Agency and will inform the Historic Preservation Board of things that come up.
